Rods:

- 4-5 wt, 8 ft+ | Brown Trout
- 8 wt+, 8 ft+ | Salmon & Sea Trout
- A light/medium spinning rod

Flies:

- Dry flies
- Euro nymphs
- Regular nymphs
- · Salmon & Sea Trout flies
- · Spoons and spinners

Recommended:

- Waders
- Fly vest
- Small net
- Polarised sunglasses

Trout Licence

A trout licence is required in the UK to legally fish for non-migratory trout and coarse fish in freshwater.

Salmon & Sea Trout Licence

A salmon and sea trout licence is needed to fish for migratory salmonids in rivers, streams, and other freshwater locations across the UK.

The River Coquet

Home to resilient brown trout, with visits from migratory Atlantic salmon and sea trout.

Our Stretch

The river runs between steep sides with overhanging trees. The best way to access and fish it is by wading. As a spate river, it colours up quickly when it rains. The water changes from fast runs full of trout to deeper pools that hold larger migratory fish. Best fished from within the river.

The Pylon

Our stretch of the River Coquet beat starts from the large electrical pylon downstream on the river.

The Bench

Fishing is permitted up to the bench located a few hundred metres upstream of the Priory and Manor House.
